Ways to Practice Sight Words

- •Gwat
 - Write the words on cards and hit with a fly swatter
- •Word Walk
 - Write the words on paper plates and create a path. Gay the words as you walk.
- Spot the Word
 - Write words on cards. Dim the lights and shine a flashlight a word. Have your child say the word.
- Puzzling Words
 - Take a puzzle and write sight words on the back of each piece. Before they can place a piece, they need to tell you the word.
- Catch the Word
 - Write the sight word on a ball (or rolled up paper) and throw your child the word. They have to read the word that they caught.
- Playdoh
 - Make the words with playdoh snakes.
- •Letter stamps
 - Make words with letter stamps.
- Write the words in sand.
- Sight Word Memory
- Magazine Gearch
 - Find the words in magazines and cut them out.

- Find the Pom-Pom
 - Hide a pom-pom (or any small object) under small cups that have sight words on them. Student needs to say sight word before lifting up the cut to see if item is hidden underneath.
- Kaboom!
 - Write sight words on popsicle sticks and add the word "Kaboom" to a few. Draw sticks out of a cup and say word. If you draw a Kaboom you lose all your sticks.
- Rainbow Write
 - Write each word in all the colors of the rainbow.
- Build with Bricks
 - Take Legos or Duplo blocks and write letters on them. Connect them to make sight words.
- Gearch for Sight Words
 - Place letter tiles or magnets in a bin with any small material (corn, beans, sand, etc.) and search for the letters to make each sight word.
- Shaving Cream
 - Place shaving cream on a table and write the words with your finger.
- Dot Paint
 - Dot paint the words with a Q-tip.
- Type Words
 - Practice typing the words on a keyboard or a keyboard cover.

- Chalk Walk
 - Write the words in chalk and walk/hop/skip to certain words that parents call out.
- Hop Scotch
- Bowling
 - Place the words on bowling pins. Read the words you knock down.
- Target Practice
 - Put the words on cards and place them on walls. Have your student shoot the words with a nerf gun.
- Egg Find
 - Place the words in plastic eggs and have students search for them. Crack the egg and read the word.
- Word Towers
 - Place words on block or cups and have students tell you the word before they can stack it.
- Sight Word Jenga
 - Write words on a Jenga set. Read each word as you pull it out.
